

Week 3 of Immeasurably More Series Group Discussion Guide

1. On Sunday, we continued our journey through the book of Acts and looked at Acts 2:1–13 and the coming of the Holy Spirit at Pentecost.

What do you remember most from the message?

2. A central idea from this passage is that God doesn't just work for us (His timing), He works in us and through us by His Spirit.

In your own words, what does that mean?

Can you think of a time when you felt God giving you strength, boldness, or wisdom beyond what you normally have?

3. Read Acts 2:1–4 together.

What details stand out to you most about how the Holy Spirit comes—(sound like a mighty rushing wind, tongues of fire, all filled and speaking in other languages)?

How do you picture this scene in your mind?

4. Read Acts 1:4–5, 8. (Optional: also read Luke 3:16 or John 14:16–17.)

How do these passages show God keeping His promises about the Holy Spirit?

What does this teach us about God's timing and faithfulness?

5. Read Acts 2:5–11 together.

What surprises you most about what happens when the disciples begin speaking in other languages?

What does this moment show us about God’s heart for all nations, cultures, and people?

6. Read Acts 2:9–11

Look at the list of regions and people groups. What does this variety tell you about God’s heart and plan for the world?

How does Pentecost show that God’s timing is not just about our personal story, but about His global mission?

7. Read Acts 2:12–13 together.

The crowd responds in different ways: some are amazed, some are confused, some make fun and say they’re drunk.

How do you see those same kinds of responses to God or the Holy Spirit today?

Which response do you most relate to in different seasons of your life—amazed, confused, skeptical?

8. (Optional: Read Galatians 5:22–23 and Ephesians 5:18.)*

What do these passages teach us about what it looks like to be “filled with the Spirit” in everyday life—not just in dramatic moments like Acts 2?

Where in your life right now do you most need the Holy Spirit’s power or fruit (love, joy, peace, patience, etc.)?

9. The disciples moved from a season of waiting in the Upper Room to a moment of bold witness in the streets.

In what ways might God be calling you out of “waiting mode” and into “witness mode” in this season (home, work, school, neighborhood)?

10. As a small group, what are some practical ways we can be more open and responsive to the Holy Spirit’s leading—together?

(Examples: more time in prayer, listening, obedience, sharing faith, serving, confession, worship.)

11. Where are you personally sensing God stirring something new in you through this passage—something to start, stop, surrender, or step into by faith?

12. Spend some time lifting one another up in prayer.

Pray specifically that:

- The Holy Spirit would fill and empower each person
- God would break down barriers (fear, shame, division)
- We would be bold, loving witnesses for Jesus right where we are
