Text: Acts 3–4

1. **When you hear the word “resilient,” what image or person comes to mind for you? Why?**
2. **From Sunday’s sermon, what stood out to you most and why?**
3. **Why do you think Peter immediately redirected the crowd’s amazement away from himself and toward Jesus?**
Follow-up (if discussion needs further context)
 - a. *What does this teach us about how we should respond when God works through us?*
 - b. *Where are we tempted to take credit or put the spotlight on people instead of Christ?*
4. *Peter says, “You acted in ignorance,” then calls them to repent.*
Why is it important that Peter both confronts their sin and offers hope?
5. *Peter promises “seasons of refreshing” for those who repent.*
What do you think “seasons of refreshing” can look like in life?
Follow-up (if discussion needs further context)
 - a. Have you ever experienced spiritual renewal after repentance?
 - b. What keeps people from turning back to God?
6. *Peter and John are arrested, yet the church grows to about 5,000 men.*
What does this teach us about resilience in the Christian life?
Follow-up (if discussion needs further context)
 - a. Why do you think opposition often accompanies gospel impact?
 - b. How do we personally respond when faith costs us something socially or relationally?
7. *The sermon emphasized that God’s Word accomplishes what He sends it to do (Isaiah 55:10–11).*
How does this promise change the way we share our faith?
Follow-up (if discussion needs further context)
 - a. What fears keep you from speaking about Jesus?
 - b. How does trusting God with the outcome free us from pressure?
8. **Who is one person currently on your heart who does not know Jesus? What has kept you from talking with them? What would one faithful next step look like this week?**
